- 1. Entries must be postmarked on or before August 14th, 2019. After this date all entries will be considered Post Entry at double fees.
- 2. Stabling will be tie stalls with the possibility of stalls.
- 3. All entries must be on the grounds not later than 10 p.m., Friday August 30th 2019 and remain on the grounds until 6 p.m., Monday, September 2nd, 2019.
- 4. The weight division between light, medium and heavy geldings will be decided upon by the Draft Horse Show Convenor
- 5. The show is open to all, but the Draft Horse Show Convenor reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 6. The Draft Horse Show Convenor reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the Rules and correct any error or make necessary alterations in the Rules, Prize List or Catalogue.
- 7. The Draft Horse Show Convenor reserves unto itself the power to bar any horse and/or exhibitor from the show ring without being liable for compensation.
- 8. When in the ring, drivers, attendants and grooms must be neatly and suitably attired. The Draft Horse Show Convenor may, at its discretion, bar any exhibitor from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.
- 9. The Draft Horse Show Convenor reserves the right to cancel any class.
- 10. Any class with less than two (2) entries, with the exception of the stallion class, may be combined. Exhibitors will be notified if possible.
- 11. For Halter classes, a photocopy of each horse's registration papers must be included with your entry. Failing this, your entry will be returned to you.
- 12.DEFINITION OF A JUNIOR is a person under the age of 18 as of January 1st of the current year.

- 13. Pre-junior is a child between the age of 5 and 8 years old as of January 1st of the current year. Pre-junior until 8 years of age must be accompanied by a teamster at all times and the teamster must have a separate lead shank attached to the opposite side of the horse's halter or bridle. When the pre-junior is 8 years old, he or she must be accompanied by a teamster at all times. Horse must be calm and under control at all times. Pre-junior must wear a hard hat during the class. Pre-junior must be covered under BC Horse Council Insurance.
- 14. All foals must be exhibited on the halter. Mares to be held in a designated area within the ring.
- 15. Foals to be held in a designated area within the ring while mares are shown at halter.
- 16. Any horse not sufficiently under control shall be asked to leave the ring.
- 17.FIVE (5) MINUTE TIME LIMIT: To prevent delay we must adhere to a five-minute time limit between classes, after which time the gate will be closed and the class will begin.
- 18.In the event of disqualification, no prize money or ribbons will be awarded.
- 19. Absolutely no drinking of liquor in the barns or barn area. 20. Whipping, striking, cursing, and/or swearing will not be permitted and will result in immediate disqualification.
- 21.If the number of entries warrant, a division of classes may occur at the discretion of the Draft Horse Show Convenor.
- 22. Rules for the Log Skid will be posted.
- 23. Competition driving course will be posted.
- 24. JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.
- 25. STALLS NEED TO BE CLEANED COMPLETELY BEFORE PRIZE MONEY IS AWARDED.

Under <u>No Circumstances</u> shall stalls be changed without notice and approval from the Draft Horse Convenor.



- 2. All entries must be well groomed, and in good health and presented for the appreciation of our visitors.
- 3. Display and demonstrations All animals are expected to participate in at least 1 program each day of the Fair. It is the owner's responsibility to provide an adequate number of handlers for their donkeys. Donkeys in tack may also be seen on display.
- 4. All events are intended to entertain and educate our visitors and will be accompanied by a ring commentary. All animals are expected to have adequate training for owner chosen participation. No chains, crops or whips allowed.
- 5. Each stall must carry information relating to the animal (s) and accurately describe details of the animal i.e. sex, age

- **Clear, clean, easily read signs are essential**. No "For Sale" advertising or phone numbers allowed.
- 6. Cash remuneration: \$100 for each of the first 2 entries, plus \$75 for any additional entries.*
- 7. Stable space is limited and will be allotted at the discretion of the Department convenor. Early entry of your animals in this Department will allow for stable set up and must be in the hands of the convenor before the entry close date. Entry fees should be made payable to: N&S Saanich Agricultural Society.

- 1. All classes will be judged according to the General Performance Rules.
- 2. The Vancouver Island Arabian Horse Association (VIAHA) and Saanich 4-H Horse Club reserves the right to refuse entry to any party or
- 3. Individuals and/or their trainers, including minors, who have outstanding entries or stall fees owing to the VIAHA will be prohibited from participating in any further shows until the entire balance has
- 4. No training equipment will be allowed in the show arena.
- 5. In all Western classes, may be shown in a full bridle, (one hand) or a snaffle.
- 6. Gate calls are a courtesy only. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be on time for their classes.
- Exhibitor's age is as of January 1, 2019
- 8. Juniors are prohibited from handling or riding a stallion.

- 9. Novice class eligibility is as of time of entry; horse not to have won 3 firsts in anv of the classes in the division.
- 10. Beginner rider: must be a rider's first year of showing.
- 11. Beginner horse: must be a horse's first year of showing.
- 12. We've Only Just Begun: Must be a rider's or horse's first year of showing. Canter/Lope will be called.
- 13. Exhibitors must produce proof of BC Horse Council membership or will be charged for a new membership.
- 14. Exhibitors are not allowed to approach or ask questions of the judge during the show unless authorized by the show committee.
- 15. Numbers may be displayed on exhibitor's back or on saddle pad. If displayed on saddle pad it must be on both sides. (Extra number provided by exhibitor)

- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1/3 cup canola oil
- 1/2 cup warm coffee (mix 1/2 cup hot water with 1 teaspoon instant coffee)
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 cup chopped pecans

RECIPE:

- 1. Preheat oven to 340 degrees Farenheit. Grease 9x5-inch loaf pan.
- 2. In a large bowl, sift together flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg. Set aside.

- 3. In a mixer bowl fitted with a whisk attachment, whisk together eggs, granulated sugar, and honey on medium high speed until light and fluffy, 2-3 minutes. On low speed and with the mixer running, slowly add the oil and vanilla extract and beat until combined. Turn off mixer. Beat in the flour mixture in 3 additions, alternating with the coffee in 2 additions, starting and ending with the flour. Beat until smooth. Do not over-mix.
- 4. Pour the batter into prepared loaf pan. Sprinkle with nuts. Bake for 35-45 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into tHe centre of the cake comes out clean. If the top is browning too fast while baking, cover pan loosely with aluminum foil. Allow cake to cool for 10 minutes, then remove from pan and set on a wire rack to cool completely.

PHOTOGRAPHY TIPS FROM THE JUDGES

- 1. In pictures featuring humans or animals, make sure that legs, feet, tails and the like all appear in the picture and are not accidentally cut off.
- 2. In pictures involving a horizon, like landscapes or seascapes, ensure the horizon is straight horizontally.
- 3. Avoid overexposing the lighter coloured parts of your pictures.
- 4. Watch for false shadowing in your picture and change your angle to the light source if you find unplanned shadows on faces or foreground objects.
- 5. In classes like "Human Beings" and "Child Life," ensure the picture tells a story. Put your pictures into a scene
- Try to avoid having your foreground object appear dead centre in the photo.
 Putting it slightly off the centre line, both vertically and horizontally, will create a much more pleasing appearance.
- 7. Ensure the key parts of your photo are as sharply in focus as possible.

8. If printing digital photos at home, be very careful of colour quality. The most common fault is having too much yellow in your colour mix. Better yet, for first-rate prints for competition, take your photos in to have them printed.





GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All entries must be made on proper entry forms provided and accompanied by entry fees in full. Cash may be brought in with entry forms, or fees may be sent in with a Money Order, or acceptable Cheque, made payable to North & South Saanich Agricultural Society. Entries must be in the hands of the Fair Secretary, 1528 Stellys Cross Road, Saanichton, BC, V8M 1S8 before the closing date indicated in each Department.
 - NO ENTRY FEE IS REFUNDABLE ON CANCELLED ENTRIES
- 2. All animals and/or stock must be entered in the name of the owner and said owner to have been in possession of same at least thirty (30) days prior to date of entry, except where otherwise stated in Dept. Rules.
- All exhibits with the exception of Stock, Poultry, Rabbits etc. to have been grown or be the work of the exhibitor, and be of this year's production, unless otherwise stated in Department Rules.
- Exhibitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to whatever they exhibit, and at the appointed time take complete charge of the same.
- In the absence of competition in any class, the judges have the power to award any such prize as they judge the animal or article deserves. In no case will prize be awarded unless the exhibit is worthy.
- 6. The judges decision is final.
- All prize awards, ribbons and/or tickets which have been awarded must be displayed during the Exhibition. Anyone refusing to do so shall forfeit his or her prize.
- 8. Each sheet shall bear the signatures of the Judge(s) and any comments he or they may make. When respectfully requested to do so, judges may give reasons for their decisions.
- 12. The Directors may request that any animal be produced for review at any time during the exhibition. Any attendant, or owner, refusing or neglecting to bring such animal out as directed shall forfeit his or her entry fees and any prize money which may have been awarded.
- 13. In case of a tie in points, the Exhibitor obtaining the greatest number of first prizes will be declared the winner.

- 14. Where there is a class for a specific article or product, that type of article may not be shown in the general class. For example, petit point may not be shown in a general embroidery class.
- 15. No exhibit will be released before close of the exhibition, 6:00 pm, Monday. The Society is not responsible for exhibits left on the grounds after the Fair closes. Check with the Fair office.
